1. Voter Registration Trends




Registration Trends

- Online Voter Registration—38 states
- Interstate Data Matching—21 states
- * Automated Motor Voter—hard to say



2. Voting Itself





Early In-Person Voting

- Usually done in one location
- Spreads voting out (may reduce) lines)
- Secure--ballots never leave the office
- Voters like convenience
- No political advantage



No-Excuse Absentee Voting

- Absentee system already in place
- Scanners needed for paper ballots
- Can slow down results
- Voters like convenience
- No political advantage


Get an Absentee Ballot

Any eligible voter can vote early with an absentee ballot!








- Recruitment options




Finding Polling Places

State	Voting System	Funding
Maryland	DRE -> Paper	Lease
Rhode Island	Paper → Paper	State paid
Colorado	DRE-All-mail (paper)	Counties pay (state helps)
New Mexico	Paper > Paper	State: \$8M over 2 years


- * Voter ID
